By now I trust sense will have emerged from the flurry of telegrams that have recently descended upon you about the News Letter. As Hans Welser's letter (ODM 3191/21) of 4 October indicated, we had decided to play Indonesian events on the lines of "this gives us all a splendid chance". Our telegram of 8 October amplified that line.

2. The piece suggested in your (SE/01/65) of 5 October was very good of its kind, but the facts are still obscure making an historical analysis difficult and, moreover, the Indonesian Army are making splendid running on the line "it was a Communist plot".

Possibility is, therefore, to be in circulation in Indonesia by following week.
